A vision for Christ Church St Kilda Dear Christ Church Parishioners,

The weather App on my phone tells me that we are being given some respite from hot weather until the middle of next week – at least.

Do we ever wonder "what is the App" which will help us to see how we are going as Christians in today's world? Possibly not – but – however – the Bible, is the Christian's "daily bread" – sustenance, as well as that which "guides" our lives.

This Sunday's Scripture Readings are our guidance from God to help us keep on track as Christians in our world.

St. Paul, in his letter to the Corinthian Church, (1 Corinthians 2:1-5), speaks of his own weaknesses in oratory, philosophy and the human power of persuasion. He admits to feeling "fear and trembling" as he came amongst the Corinthians to preach and to live amongst them during his time in Corinth. For Paul – everything is for Christ – and so he says quite openly that "only a demonstration of the power of the Spirit" was of the utmost importance so that those who heard Paul speak and those who observed his life would see and know the "power of God" at work in him.

This evidence of the Holy Spirit at work in the lives of Christians, Jesus speaks of in the Gospel reading we are focusing on today. Jesus says that we Christians *are* the *salt* of the earth and the *light* of the world.

Jesus is not saying that we <u>will be</u> the salt of the earth and that we <u>will be</u> the light of the world – but that we <u>are!</u>

Salt was very important as a preservative of food – especially in times past when there were no refrigerators.

We are also very aware that during Jesus' lifetime, electricity had not been invented and the convenience we enjoy at the flick of a switch was unknown. Light was then considered in a different light to how it is today! If an area was to be well lit, back then, the "light" would be placed where its effect would take away the darkness in as wide an area as possible.

By virtue of our faith in the Son of God, our Lord Jesus Christ, we Christians are to influence for good and for God, by the way we live our lives so that others will turn, not to us, but to God whom we serve with our lives. Salt and light are to be of the very essence of our beings as Christians in todays' world.

This is not "easy" for any of us, especially when Christians are not at all accepted today in our society. It would appear that the "press" love to ridicule

the Christian church and anyone who attempts to live their lives by our "rule book", our "App for life" – the Bible.

Ultimately it is in the living of our lives as Christians, that the world judges us. As the Scripture passage from Isaiah challenges, it is in our "actions" of "sharing your bread with the hungry" and "shelter the homeless poor" and "clothe the one who is naked" that our "works" will be seen, as, St. Paul was at pains to say, those who observe the behaviour of Christians, will be drawn to God whom we serve – not ourselves.

The "world" so admired Mother Teresa of Calcutta and her Sisters of Charity – because of how they lived their lives, attending to the poor, the hungry, the dying in Calcutta.

The "world" is surely influenced for God by the way this Parish cares for the hungry, the homeless, those with addictions, etc., at our Christ Church Mission Centre.

"The most obvious *general characteristic* of salt is that it is essentially different from the medium into which it is put. Its power lies precisely in this difference. So it is, says Jesus, with His disciples. Their power in the world lies in their difference from it." Tasker.

It is not "easy" to be different to all around us in our world – the transforming power of the Holy Spirit enables us to be <u>salt</u> and <u>light</u> in our world – to draw others to Jesus whom we serve and to whom we give all the glory. *Mother Gail.*

## THE ULURU STATEMENT FROM THE HEART

There is a lot of discussion in the community about the plan for a referendum to add an indigenous Voice to Parliament to the Australian constitution to enable Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to provide advice to the Parliament on policies and projects that impact their lives. This plan comes from the Uluru Statement from the Heart which is an invitation to all Australians.
